

## Class of '70 Gift Fund

Good news! We have raised \$55,365, up \$5,355 since our last newsletter, thanks to new donors Anonymous, Clifford Boland, Michael A. Holland, Agnes D. Hall Houston-Polson, William F. Mosier, Allard A. Thomas, and repeat donors: Celia May Laramie Baldwin, Pamela Reid Katz, Edwin S. Leighton, Cynthia Neese Bailes, Norman L. Nelson, Janie L. Pearson, Cheryl J. Pierce, Mary Telles Ruffa, Mary Jean Secoolish,

Joel M. Silberstein, Charles F. Theel, and two repeat donors who wish to remain anonymous.

We need to raise \$14,635 in order to reach our goal of \$70,000 by October 31, 2020. We will reach out to class members who have not yet contributed to our class gift fund. Our participation rate is at exactly 52.76%--86 out of 163 class members have donated. We do aim to raise this to 70% or more of our class members by October 31.

### **Class of '70 Endowment Fund**

Last month we sent a survey asking for a Y/N vote on establishing the Class of 1970 Endowment for the purpose of scholarships for students in good standing who demonstrate financial need, and to include international students. The results of our recent survey are as follows:

And, one comment expressing a desire for periodical reports on the breakdown of US and international students receiving scholarships.

Given only 23.5% of our class members responded to this survey, we plan to take the decision process one step further. We have invited our top 10 donors, who have as a group contributed over 50% of the total funds raised to meet with us via Zoom on August 25<sup>th</sup>. Together we will carefully consider our options. We will confirm the scholarship criteria, explore a two-endowment option, and entertain any additional ideas.

A final proposal will be sent to you all for a vote. Stay tuned. In the meantime, go and donate \$30.00 or \$70.00 or \$700.00 today. Thank you!

Our Unforgettable Experiences Submitted by Barry and Vicki (Shank) Harlan

**Barry Harlan '70** and his wife, Vicki Shank '72 were volunteers the Jeevan Gnanodaya School for the Deaf in Chengalpattu, India, for three weeks in September and October of 2009. They shared their experiences and observations in an informal report to ASHA for Education, a registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization based in the United States that works with over 200 projects across rural India. ASHA means "hope" in Sanskrit, which is a primary liturgical language of Hinduism in India.



We lost our assistant manager, David Whiggun, who now resides in the Prep Dropout Cemetery. We selected Robert Webster as his replacement.



## A Letter to Class of 1970



To Class of 1970,

In the Issue No. 17 Newsletter, the photo of the graduation party for Class of '70 at my relatives' house popped in my memory after 50 years.

Let me introduce the hosts of the party, my uncle and aunt, Commander Carl E. Lair, Jr. and Rosette Stefanoni Lair, the Navy wife. Both Rosette and my mother are sisters. They live in Alexandria, Virginia, 3 miles from George Washington Masonic National Memorial. Uncle Carl prepared and cooked the glorious foods especially his favorite Caesar's dressing for us at the party.

Mary Telles-Ruffa Uncle Carl came from Texas and Aunt Rosette, California. When WWII began, Carl saw action with the Navy and Rosette dropped out of high

school and entered the work force supporting our country. In Livermore, California, the two met and got married. They had no children.

Uncle Carl was the Naval aviator and carrier pilot in the Atlantic and Pacific theaters during both WWII and Korean War. His post-war duties included command, staff and administrative assignments at sea and ashore.

Uncle Carl was the executive officer and commanding officer of Fighter Squadrons and served on the staff of a carrier air group. He was the Commander of Naval forces in the Atlantic, Patuxent River Naval Air Test Station as well as the Bureau of ordinance aeronautics and naval personal at the Naval Intelligence School.

While I was a student at Gallaudet College, Uncle Carl worked at Pentagon. I visited him and he took me on a tour. Wow! It had everything such as PX store, clothing store, barber shop, salon, and café, etc. Also, it had a line of four wheeled vehicle carts operated by electricity connecting underground to Congress, the Senate and House of Representatives buildings, White House and other places.

I owe Rosette a lot because she first introduced me to Gallaudet College when I was a little girl. She showed me the photos taken of me on the Campus. While growing up, she always emphasized to me how important is to get a good education. Also, I am thankful to Gallaudet for giving me the opportunity to obtain a higher education. Gallaudet encouraged me NOT to drop out when I was in Preparatory Class after encountering a tragic experience on Friday, October 17<sup>th</sup>. Uncle Carl, at the age of 71, died of cancer on November 10, 1992 at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda. He rests in Arlington National Cemetery. Aunt Rosette is now 96 years old. She has dementia and is in the care of two very nice caregivers at the very same house where the graduation party was held!

I salute Uncle Carl and Aunt Rosette for their generosity to all of us including me! Mary Telles-Raffa
