2006 – When we finally cast our ropes and sold the sailboat, we traveled via motorcycle/sidecar all over USA, Alaska and Canada. Then we traveled via VW bus and currently, the Sprinter RV to distant places like Labrador; Newfoundland; Alaska; ventured above the Arctic Circle to Inuvik, NWT and beyond. Being avid boondockers and rural off-road travelers, we plan to continue our travels in Canada and USA for the foreseeable future till our bodies tell us otherwise!
